***From Your Grand Knight:* Frank Montelione**

Many of you know my wife is Jewish. Although our children are baptized Catholics we raised them to know and understand both faiths. It wasn't difficult. In fact the Jewish faith gave me more of an insight and a deeper understanding and appreciation of our faith.

Over the years we have hosted Seder Dinners. The Seder dinner is the traditional dinner held on the first night of Passover. It commemorates the release of the Jews from bondage under the pharos of Egypt. This was the night that the Lord instructed the Jews to put lambs blood on their door post so that the angel of death would pass over their homes. It is believed that the Last Supper was in fact a Seder Dinner.

A lamb was sacrificed to save the Jews. A Lamb was sacrificed to save the entire world. The Catholic Mass' formula is the Seder Dinner. The table is set, the cups are poured and the bread is broken. The words of blessing at the Seder are word for word the same blessings that are used at Mass. "Blessed art thou oh Lord our God, ruler of the universe who created the fruit of the vine..." We owe much to the Jewish faith.

Why do I bring this up at this time of year? The first and second weeks of October were Rosh Hashanah, the Jewish New Year, and Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement. These 10 days encompass the high holidays of the Jews. At the beginning of the celebration God opens his book and reviews the year. During this period the opportunity to make amends for transgressions is open. By the end of the 10 days saying you are sorry for those transgressions is not enough. They must reach out and make every effort to close the chasm that may have been built because of offenses that were committed.

It is a time for reflection and a time to look ahead. Can you remember what caused you the most grief a year ago? Was there something that happened recently that you think you will have a hard time forgiving? Where will you be a year from now and do you think that those "transgressions" that you suffer today will be remembered in 2006?

Take a lesson from our forefathers in faith, the Jews. Nothing is so important in this life that you should risk eternity for. Reflect on the past but look to the future.

VOTE NEEDED

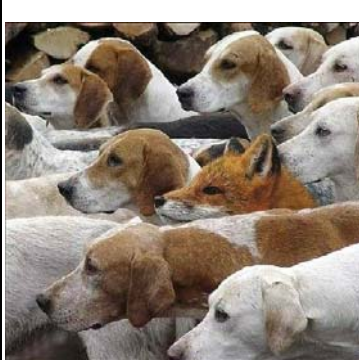

Spotlight on David Rouser



When you are in deep trouble, say nothing, and try to look like you know what you're doing.

Many people make associations or refer to African Americans however David is a true African-American. He was born of American parents in Morocco!! By his own admission, he still can't dance or play basketball!! David is the youngest of 4 sons born to Rocky and Lois Rouzer. Lois, a stay at home mother, met her career military husband while volunteering at the USO in 1945, following the death of her 1st husband. She admits she wasn't so attracted to Rocky at first but, "He was so persistent!" Like father, like son. Rocky was a WWII aviator recruited to flight school from his crop duster job in 1942. He flew right up to the few weeks that preceded his death from cancer in 2002. Of 4 sons only one took up aviation as a career: Philip, son #3. He resides in Indialantic and is on permanent disability from Continental Airlines. Out of 4 sons, however, David was the only one to take-up the game of golf! All 4 boys still play tennis. It is quite a scene during the holidays when they play. Although a tennis court is the desired location all pros and most novices agree it more closely resemble, Kill the Man with the Ball!!

Bill Rouzer, the oldest, at 60, celebrated his retirement as a contract manager from Rockwell-Collins in California by riding his bicycle from Portland Oregon to Portland Maine. He then peddled down to Columbus Ohio to visit Jack Rouzer, son #2. Jack is a professor at Ohio State University. After a stint teaching in mainland China, where he married one of his female students, he returned to teach at the University of Hawaii. "He was drawn to Ohio where there was a grant and a research team attempting to assign numeric values to human sounds as to mathmatize or establish a universal language, I think".

All 4 boys went to different schools. "After one Rouzer attended, they wouldn't allow another.", claims David. Bill; University of North Carolina, Jack; Florida State, Philip, University of Florida and David, UCF in Orlando where he grew up since moving there in 1968. David is a salesman by birth. His father said he could sell a portrait to a statue. "I enjoyed selling real estate but I couldn't make any real money at it. My Uncle was successful at selling real estate and insurance so I started selling insurance. I don't know how he could do both because, to me, both are so time consuming or specialized." "In my 3rd year selling insurance I made nearly \$100,000!! I've been selling insurance ever since although, I'm at approximately one fourth of that lately."

At age 32 I met, then married, (as opposed to married then met) my wife of 15 years, Amy. "Although we had fun trying, we were not able to have children of our own so, we became foster parents thinking that we could be parents to children who don't have parents". David and Amy could tell thousands of tales, most good, some sad, about their experiences and are always willing to do so when asked. They have now adopted 3 children: 2 boys and 1 girl. Gabriel Hayes; age 10, named after David's father's real name, Molly Jo; age 7 named after Amy's mother and Christian Allan; age 6 named after his uncle and his father's oldest brother.

"Outside of my faith in God and good health, my greatest gift is my family", says David. "I had an excellent childhood and upbringing". All the Rouzer's have a strong and renewed faith in their Lord, Jesus Christ as their Saviour. Bill doesn't stand on a box and scream it but, you can feel it in his presence and by his actions. Jack is very active in his church. While teaching English to his Communist Chinese students, he would pepper their lessons with passages from the Bible. Even-though he was under strict orders not to preach the gospel, some students would approach him afterwards and inquire as to the source of such profound statements.

It was primarily through Philip's illness that he surrendered his life to the Lord completely. Today, he and his group of Christian friends can be found at the Melbourne Beach Park praying and sharing every Saturday morning. Philip spends his time and gas money driving sailors around Port Canaveral while sharing his faith. "Although I never killed anybody or robbed a bank or anything like that, I still wasn't living my life for the Lord, which is almost just as bad", says David. "It was at a men's weekend retreat that it became clear to me that God is real and he loves me, (and you) very, very much. I felt so guilty and ashamed for all the selfish things I had done. I cried helplessly until I prayed the prayer of forgiveness and professed unwavering dedication. From that point forward, with a few minor setbacks, I have lived my life for the Lord." David feels that a life of Christ is not a destination but, more of a journey to our final destination. "It's like climbing a steep and sometimes slippery slope. You make some headway forward and then, at times, slip back a bit. There is always a time to stop and look around and take in the beauty of God's creation and the roll the Devil plays in it. Then, you refocus and climb a little higher". After relocating to South Brevard and Holy Name of Jesus Catholic Church in 1999, he would talk to a couple of his newly made friends he met while attending the Christ Renews His Parrish Retreat, about ways they could put their faith into action. "We wanted to impact the world's problems. We wanted to make a difference. We would want to do this about that but, it would take too much time. We would want to do that about this but, it would take too much money and we would feel helpless. It was then that God spoke to me through the voice of Jim Beyers when he said, "Come join the Knights of Columbus, we could use a fellow like you".

Many of us know David as our former Supreme Council Representative and Knights of Columbus Insurance Field Agent; a position he held for one full year. "I had just started with State Farm and bought a quarter million dollar policy on myself for my family when I got my newsletter in the mail and saw an ad from then Field Agent, Corey Aun. It reminded me of a visit I had from Al Greco upon completing my 1st Degree years prior. The Knights then issued me a half million dollar policy for only 14% more premium!! We were so impressed."David goes on to say, "But I was never so impressed as I was representing the Knights of Columbus and working with my fellow brother Knights." David is now our Council's membership director and gives primary credit to Grand Knight Frank Montilone and Deputy Grand Knight Dale Saunders for this year's successful membership efforts. Thursday, October 20th, 2005 at 7:00PM will be the 1st time in approximately 35 years that a First Degree Exemplification will take place at our Holy Name of Jesus Catholic Church. We are excited and grateful for this event and, with David's participation, will continue to look forward to great things for our Council, our Church, our country and our families.

All of us who know Dave wish him the best in this new endeavor and know he'll succeed. He is one of the most sincere and hardest working Knights within the Council. I feel very lucky to know Dave and know he and his family have made my experience just that much better while becoming a fellow Knight and member of HNJ. Thanks Dave for all the help!!!
