Spiritual Reflection

In the month of August, the church commemorates the Transfiguration of Our Lord (August 6th) and the Assumption of our Blessed Mother (August 15th).

Our Lord's Transfiguration on Mount Tabor (Matthew 1: 1-9) was a visible sign in the presence of reliable witnesses (Peter, James, and John) of the reality of the power and the Glory of God. Jesus' transfiguration was a unique display of His divine character and a glimpse of the glory, which Jesus had

before He became incarnate. The voice of God attested to the truth of Jesus' Divine Sonship for a second time, the first was at Jesus' Baptism. It is also interesting to note that the Old Testament law which required three witnesses to attest to any fact as satisfied both in earth and in heaven.

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven at the end of her earthly life is a defined dogma of our Catholic Church. It has been cele-

brated in the East since the fourth century and universally since the sixth century. It commemorates the Dormition (Falling Asleep) of Mary and her bodily assumption into Heaven, before her body could begin to decay. It is a foreshadowing of our own bodily resurrection at the end of time. Since it signifies the Blessed Virgin's passing into eternal life, it is celebrated as the most important of all Marian feasts.

Now is the time to prepare for the Roman Missal, Third Edition

The *Roman Missal, Third Edition*, the ritual text containing prayers and instructions for the celebration of the Mass, is now being prepared for publication. **The Roman Missal will be implemented in the United States of America on the First Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011.**

Pope John Paul II announced a revised version of the *Missale Romanum* during the Jubilee Year 2000. Among other things, the revised edition of the *Missale Romanum* contains prayers for the observances of recently canonized saints, additional prefaces for the Eucharistic Prayers, addi-

tional Votive Masses and Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions, and some updated and revised rubrics (instructions) for the celebration of the Mass. The English translation of the *Roman Missal* will also include updated translations of existing prayers, including some of the well-known responses and acclamations of the people.

The entire Church in the United States has been blessed with this opportunity to deepen its understanding of the Sacred Liturgy, and to appreciate its meaning and importance in our lives. Holy Name of

Jesus has begun the process of catechizing the parish leadership and community to receive this new translation.

A four session workshop: **Encountering Christ in the Words of the Mass, The Third Edition of the Roman Missal: Embracing the Revised Translation** will be facilitated by Deacon Joe Gassman and Peg Smith on Sunday evenings **beginning August 21st**, in Room 101 from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. Now is the time to seize the opportunity given to us for all Catholics in the United States to **deepen, nurture, and celebrate** our faith through the renewal of our worship and the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy.
